
Jimmy Jones read the itinerary for the coming Canadian trip. The total cost for the trip will be \$38.31.

Letter was read to the Club from Jimmy Spears.



The last meeting of the Downeast Ski Club was held on Feb. 5 with Howard Jewett President presiding.


The secretary and treasurer's reports were read and approved.

Helen reported that \$207.21 was collected on the raffle, with a deduction of \$25.00 for printing. We netted approximately \$182.21 on the raffled.





Further discussion is to be held about these suggestion.



Lin Stoddard, Chairman of Entertainment, was asked to have a movie for the next meeting.

The last meeting of the Down East Ski Club was held at the Y. M. C. A. with Howard Jewett President, presiding.


The treasurer's report was read and approved.

The last meeting of the Down East Ski Club was held on April 23, with Howard Jewett, President, presiding.


The Secretary and Treasurer's reports were read and approved.
